### Happy Camp: 2024



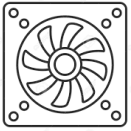
- As predicted, the minute we cleaned out all our Happy Camp supplies, the Rec Center decided to resurrect it.

- In the meantime they have also offered to install a damper switch to shut off the exhaust to save on air conditioning.
