

MASK MAKING

Supplies:

Vegetable (Oak) tanned leather - 2-3 oz. or 4-5 oz. works well, although any weight will do.
Craft knife and/or shears
Ballpoint Stylus
Tracing Film

Optional Supplies:

Beads, bone hair pipes, feathers, permanent markers, Cova® Color Paints (acrylic),
Tandy Leather dye or stains.

Instructions:

- Step 1: Using a pencil, trace mask pattern onto tracing film.
- Step 2: Wet leather lightly with sponge or spray bottle. Transfer pattern from tracing film to moist leather using ballpoint stylus. Cut out pattern.
- Step 3: Carefully shape mask by hand to fit contour of face. Allow mask to dry completely.
Yes, it's really that easy!

Options:

Try cutting the original shape a little larger and curl the edges over for a smooth finished edge.
Cut an oversized mask so you can fringe the edges or add hair on top.
Make your mask with the suede side out.
Add beads or feathers as earrings or decorations (eyebrows, mustaches).

Try Tandy stains and Pro Dye to add overall color to the mask.
(Be sure it is completely dry before doing this step.)
Use Cova® Color Paints to highlight contours.
