
September 2023 LC Newletter

Leather Cabinet:

Tool Drawers:

Air Cleaner & Contaminant Exhaust:



- The Rec Center has agreed to install an air cleaner with a containment hood exhaust fan over the staining station to help with the air quality in the room.
- This is a large ticket item so needs to be added to the 2024 Rec Center Budget which means it would be installed in 2025.
- In the meantime they have also offered to install a damper switch to shut off the exhaust to save on air conditioning.
- This may help the air quality in the clubroom as well. All will be done at no cost to the club.
